THE VINEYARDS

Mendoza means more than just Malbecs. One small region in the legendary Uco Valley is becoming legendary for innovative, handmade, terroir-driven wines. Welcome to Los Chacayes, the height of Argentinian winemaking at 3,700 feet above sea level.

The small Uco Valley geographical indication of Los Chacayes, is fast becoming a center for winemakers seeking to expand the possibilities for terroir-driven Argentina wines.

EXCEPTIONAL CONDITIONS FOR WINE GROWING

In Argentina's Uco Valley, days can exceed 30° Celsius, and nights sometimes fall to 5° or lower. The drama plays out in their grapes, with healthy, concentrated fruit, beautiful color, and long ripening seasons that allow each vintage to realize its fullest potential.

THE WINEMAKERS

Mariana Onofri has worked at Chateau La Violette in Pomerol, Bordeaux, France, and has been in Sommelier in La Bourgogne in Punta Del Este Uruguay. She also did winemaking internships in Napa and France, and has launched her own wine brand, Onofri Wines.

In 2006, Pablo Martorell worked with Chateau de Lauret in Pomerol, Bordeaux, and in 2007, for Chateau Peyre Lebade and Chateau Clarke in Medoc, Bordeaux, both part of the Rothschild Group. In 2009, he worked for Napa Wine Company in California.

TASTING NOTES

The 2020 Andeval vintage reveals all of the drama of the year that created it. This year's wine is complex and elegant with beautiful acidity and fruit. Andeval pours into the glass as a brilliant, pale straw hue. Its trademark approachable fruit aromas include pear, apple and white flowers. Take a sip, and the elegant side emerges with butter, toast, earth and oak. The long finish recalls those fresh red and white fruit aromas.



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
